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1. Background

1.1. Introduction to this Call for Partnership (CFP)

The Global Center on Adaptation (GCA) invites registered non-profit organizations (local and international non-government organizations, community based organizations, universities, companies limited by guarantee) to present proposals to provide technical assistance for the development of digital soil health and fertility maps for the three selected states in Nigeria, support the digitalization of climate resilient seed supply and distribution systems, and to provide quality and tailored capacity building to breeders, seed producers, and extension agents on the development and dissemination for high quality, climate resilient seeds for a flagship agro-industrial processing zones project being implemented by the Nigeria government and the Africa Development Bank (AfDB), with GCA's climate resilience mainstreaming support.

1.2. Introduction to the Global Center of Adaptation

The Global Center on Adaptation (GCA) is an international organization that works as a solutions broker to catalyze action and support for adaptation solutions, from the international to the local, in partnership with the public and private sector, to ensure we learn from each other and work together for a climate resilient future. Adapting to impacts of climate change provides a "win-win" for livelihoods, food security, water supply, health, security, and economic growth. The work of GCA elevates the visibility and political importance of climate adaptation and facilitates solutions, such as smarter investments, new technologies and better planning to become more resilient to climate related threats. GCA is a rapidly growing organization with offices in Abidjan, Beijing, Dhaka, Groningen, and Rotterdam.

GCA's ambitious 2020-2025 business plan and strategy have three pillars:

- Programs: Food Security; Using Nature for more resilient infrastructure; Water for Urban Growth and Resilience; Climate Finance; Youth Leadership.
- Knowledge: Building adaptation knowledge globally through cutting edge products such as the State and Trends in Adaptation Report and the Adaptation Knowledge Portal.
- Advocacy and Awareness: Formulating policy messages to move the global, regional, and local adaptation agendas forward.

2. Support Project

The Nigeria Special Agro-Industrial Processing Zones (SAPZ) Program – Phase II is an initiative aimed at transforming Nigeria's agricultural sector by developing integrated agro-industrial hubs. The program is designed to enhance agricultural productivity, strengthen value chains, and attract private sector investments into agro-processing and agribusiness.

SAPZ is a program financed by the African Development Bank (AfDB) in collaboration with the Federal Government of Nigeria (FGN) and other development partners. The program is designed to address key bottlenecks limiting the growth of agro-industries in Nigeria, including weak infrastructure, inadequate access to finance, and climate risks.



SAPZ Phase II builds on the achievements of Phase I and expands its scope by incorporating digital innovations and climate-resilient seed system and adaptation practices, with technical assistance support from GCA. To the end, GCA is providing support in these three key areas:

1. Digital Soil Health & Fertility Mapping

- Development of a digital soil information system to guide precision agriculture.
- Use of remote sensing, GIS, and other analytics to assess soil health and fertility.
- Capacity-building for farmers and extension agents on soil fertility management.

2. Digitalization of Seed Supply & Distribution Systems

- Supporting the establishment of a digitalized seed system to ensure traceable and transparent distribution of high quality certified seeds.
- o Strengthening access to improved climate-resilient seed varieties.

3. Capacity Building for Climate-Resilient Foundation Seeds

- Training programs for breeders, seed producers, and extension agents on climate-smart seed systems.
- Support for the multiplication and distribution of high-yielding, drought-resistant seed varieties.

The SAPZ II Program is expected to:

- Enhance Nigeria's food security through increased productivity and reduced postharvest losses.
- Improve livelihoods by creating jobs in agro-processing and related industries.
- Strengthen climate resilience through integration of climate adaptation interventions.
- Attract private sector investment into agribusiness and agro-industrial hubs in Nigeria, thus, fostering the economic development of rural communities and states.

3. Sub-Grant Project

This project aims at supporting inclusive and sustainable agro-industrial development, while the overall objectives are to (i) support the establishment of agro-industrial zones, (ii) strengthen institutional capacity and business environment for agro-industrial development and (iii) support agricultural productivity, skills, and entrepreneurship to enhance agricultural value chain development. The project is expected to directly benefit farm households and communities, small, medium and large-scale farmers, the youth, women, and staff of related public institutions.

Specifically, the sub-grant project is seeking to strengthen the climate resilience of the SAPZ Phase II project. GCA is seeking a partner organization to provide technical assistance for the development of digital soil health and fertility maps in three selected states in Nigeria, the digitalization of climate-resilient seed supply and distribution systems, and capacity building for breeders, seed producers, and extension agents on the development and dissemination of high-quality, climate-resilient seeds.



3.1. Project Outcomes & Outputs

The overarching outcome of the Nigeria Special Agro-Industrial Processing Zones (SAPZ) Program is to increase household incomes, foster job creation in rural agricultural communities, especially for youth and women, and enhance food and nutritional security in Nigeria.

5.1. How to Apply

- Only registered non-profit organizations (e.g., INGO, NGO, CBO, Universities, Company Limited by Guarantee) are eligible to receive a sub-grant from GCA.
- The organizations responding to this call **must meet the minimum eligibility criteria** and demonstrate their capacity to **implement all the technical criteria**.
- Proposals and all supporting documents must be submitted as a PDF, no later than, 14 March 2025, 04:00 p.m, Central European Time (CET) to subgrants@gca.org and cc'd to Oluwabunmi.Ajilore@gca.org.
- Proposals **must include**:
 - **Annex 1:** Sub-Grant Project Document (proposal template) addressing the details outlined in this call.
 - **Annex 2**: Completed Partner Information Document & minimum required documents.
 - **Annex 2a**: Budget and Financial Report Template.
- Important to note:
 - All registered non-profit organizations are encouraged to respond to this call and complete the templates in as much detail as possible.
 - Responses to **Annex 1** will be considered even if there is a lack of detail or if the form is incomplete.
 - Responses to **Annex 2** will be considered even if some details are lacking, if justified.
 - The template serves as a tool for interested organizations to showcase their technical expertise and experience in response to the call.
 - Organizations need only meet the minimum eligibility criteria to be considered.
- Proposals received **after the closing** date and time **will not be considered**. Organizations will be notified once a decision about the Sub-Grant is made.

- GCA reserves the right to accept or reject any submissions, and to annul the selection process and reject all submissions at any time, without thereby incurring any liability to the affected implementing partners.

5.2. Process Overview

- After the deadline, all submissions will undergo an evaluation process.
- The most suitable partner will be selected based on the evaluation outcomes.
- The selected partner will be contacted to conduct a due diligence assessment through in-depth meetings.

6. Selection Criteria & Evaluation

The evaluation's purpose is to assess the organization's eligibility, and the technical expertise of respondents. The evaluation consists of two sets of selection criteria:

- (1) Minimum Eligibility Criteria
- (2) Technical Expertise

The first section specifies the minimum eligibility criteria that an organization must meet to qualify for the call. This set of criteria is evaluated on a pass/fail basis. Only organizations that pass this initial assessment will proceed to the next stage.

The technical expertise is evaluated based on the relevance and depth of experience and expertise in relation to the criteria outlined in the call, specifically how well these align with achieving the expected results.

6.2. Exclusionary Criteria

GCA will not engage with any entity whose public image is severely compromised by past activity or advocacy in one of the categories below, or in other areas which may be deemed, at any given time, to reflect negatively on GCA.

6.3. Evaluation

After assessing whether organizations meet the minimum eligibility criteria, the organization with the highest score in the technical evaluation **will be considered** for the sub-grant. The scoring allows GCA to identify the most suitable partner.

A preliminary capacity assessment will be conducted based on the information provided in **Annex 2.** This assessment aims to identify organizational and programmatic risks and **will not impact** the evaluation scoring or partner selection.

The insights gained from this assessment will inform the comprehensive due diligence assessment that the selected partner will undergo.
